the "constructive scepticism" of Mersenne and Gassendi, but also in the ancient atomism and philosophy of Grosseteste.

Brief presentation and transcription of H.'s manuscript classified 'E1' in the archive of Chatsworth. Crombie (Robert Grosseteste and the Origins of Experimental Science 1100–1700, Oxford, 1962) about the bonds of continuity existing on one side between Roger Bacon and Robert Grosseteste and on the other between H. and the other seventeenth century founders of modern science (p. 500).

The author points out that, unlike Bodin, H. does not
