Transforming Growth Factor-βs: Chemistry, Biology, and Therapeutics, sponsored by The New York Academy of Sciences, An International Organization, May 18–20, 1989, at the Key Bridge Marriott, Arlington, VA. Theme: The TGF-βs are receiving major attention as regulators of growth and differentiation. They appear to function in the immune and hematopoietic systems, bone growth and repair, wound healing, and cancer. This broad spectrum of activity suggests that control of the TGF-βs is a key to understanding biological mechanisms.
