INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS OF MUCOSAL IMMUNOLOGY
July 22-27, 1990 – Tokyo, Japan

The International Congress of Mucosal Immunology will be held on July 22-27, 1990 at Keio Plaza Hotel in Tokyo, Japan. This congress will focus on the immune system and local defense mechanisms at mucosal sites. Besides the local immune system and immunopathology of mucosal regions, a wide range of subjects such as cytoprotection, microcirculation of the gastrointestinal tract and the liver cell cytoskeleton will also be discussed.
