BRITISH COLUMBIA DIVISION

The 118 members of the most westerly division of the Society have enjoyed a most active programme in recent months. Economic problems were a major consideration in the closing months of 1959, but the emphasis changed to preparations for our role as host to the meeting of the Western Divisions of the Society, to be held in Victoria, April 28 to 30 this year.

Regular monthly meetings of the Division have provided the opportunity for members to hear the following speakers and topics:

- Dr. T. D. Stout, Provincial Medical Director, Canadian Red Cross Blood Transfusion Service, speaking on "Changes and Problems in the Past Five Years in Blood Transfusion Service."
- Dr. J. E. Merriman, Department of Medicine, University of Saskatchewan, discussing "Circulatory Dynamics in Health and Disease."
- Dr. R. A. Gordon, Secretary-Treasurer, Canadian Anaesthetists' Society, giving a "Review of Problems of the Canadian Anaesthetists' Society."
- Dr. R. G. B. Gilbert, Professor of Anaesthesia, McGill University, speaking about "Anaesthesia for Neurosurgery."
- Dr. Lucien Morris, Professor of Anesthesiology, University of Washington, Seattle, reviewing "Pitfalls in the Use of Anaesthetic Apparatus."

In March, the New Westminster anaesthetists were hosts to the Division for the presentation of several papers by our own members.

- The B.C. Division again this year provided a bursary to the University of British Columbia to aid a medical student chosen by the University.
- Dr. A. K. Gibbons, Dr. David Allan, and Dr. R. S. Moir have joined the group of anaesthetists at the Burnaby and Grace Hospitals in Greater Vancouver. Dr. A. C. Blair has become the Director of the Department of Anaesthesia at Burnaby General Hospital, and Dr. J. J. Carroll is Director of Anaesthesia at Grace Hospital.

One of the long-time practitioners of anaesthesia in British Columbia was lost to us with the death of Dr. Norman McLeod Thornton on January 11, 1960, at the age of 69. Dr. Thornton, a 1924 graduate of the University of Manitoba, was on the anaesthetic staff of the Vancouver General Hospital from 1928 until his retirement in 1956.

Dr. L. C. Jenkins, who recently gained the Fellowship of the Royal College of Physicians of Canada, has now joined the partnership of Associated Anaesthetic Services in Vancouver.

Dr. Irene Millar and Dr. Tom Powell have joined the staff of the Vancouver General Hospital's Department of Anaesthesia.

The Post-Graduate Course in Anaesthesia sponsored by the staff of the Vancouver General Hospital and Sub-Section of Anaesthesia of the University of British Columbia was held January 27 to 29. Dr. R. G. B. Gilbert of Montreal was

ALBERTA DIVISION

SASKATCHEWAN DIVISION

The Government of Saskatchewan has announced a Medical Care Programme to be put in operation in 1961. This is subject to the result of the provincial election due in 1960. So far the medical profession of this province has recorded its unanimous opposition to a medical care programme which is completely under Government control.

ONTARIO DIVISION

The anaesthetists of eight general hospitals in the suburbs of Toronto have formed a Society of Anaesthetists known as the Toronto Suburban Anaesthetists' Group. Meetings of the group to be held monthly, except during the summer months, at each of the suburban hospitals in turn.
