OBITUARY

Dr. George Frederick Day

The death of Dr. George Frederick Day occurred in Vancouver, B.C., on November 10, 1961. Born in Thorburn, N.S., the deceased received his B.Sc. degree from Mount Allison University, Sackville, N.B., in 1933 and his M.D., C.M. from Dalhousie University, Halifax, N.S., in 1939. Dr. Day established a general practice in New Glasgow, N.S., which he conducted until 1952 when he enrolled in the post-graduate course in Anaesthesia at McGill University. He completed his anaesthesia training at the University of British Columbia and joined Associated Anaesthetic Services and the staff of the Department of Anaesthesia of the Vancouver General Hospital in 1955.

At the time of his death the deceased was a senior partner of Associated Anaesthetic Services, Vancouver, B.C.; a member of the Attending Staff of the Vancouver General Hospital; a Clinical Instructor of the Medical Faculty, University of British Columbia; and an Associate member of the staff of the Children's Hospital, Vancouver. His hobbies were gardening and fishing and he was a member of the Vancouver Doctors' Fishing Club.

Fred Day was a fine physician and a sound clinical anaesthetist. He was extremely popular with his anaesthetic associates and other physicians with whom he had contact. His passing is deeply regretted by his associates and by the members of the B.C. Division, Canadian Anaesthetists' Society.

To his widow and family, The Canadian Anaesthetists' Society extends sincerest sympathy. Dr. Day was 49 years of age."
