Clinical Electrophysiology of Vision Course

25–27 February 1998 (with an optional half-day on 24 February 1998 for non-ophthalmologists)

This three-day course will be held by the Electrodiagnostic Department of Moorfields Eye Hospital, City Road, London, and will take place in the Clinical Tutorial Complex.
