Human Ageing and Retirement: Questions Resolved and Unresolved: Some Reflections on Contemporary Gerontology and Its Relevance to Retirement Policy, by H. A. Rhee, General Secretariat, International Social Security Administration, 154, rue de Lausanne, 1211 Geneva, Switzerland. 287 pp. 25 Swiss Francs.

Drawing upon a wide range of published and unpublished research, this study brings together data on the biological, medical, psychological, social, economic and demographic aspects of aging. The author poses questions, rather than provides answers, based on the research of himself and others, which should be considered by those working in distinct and uncoordinated fields related to aging.

Mr. Rhee analyzes five basic issues affecting the elderly: inflation and taxation, the relationship of older persons with each other and with younger age groups, man's relationship to work and occupation, functional (as against chronological) aging, and questions of health.

A three-nation committee of the Federation of Catholic Book Traders from Germany, Austria, and Switzerland, in association with the Federation of Evangelical Booksellers has issued a list of recent literature on aging and assistance to the elderly, including 130 titles. The index lists both theoretical and practical works of interest to the practitioner and books of interest to the elderly themselves.
