2nd National Plant Pathology Conference

The organisers of the Conference have arranged several tours of direct interest to plant pathology as well as for social enjoyment and sightseeing. For example, the tour of Nambour and Sunshine Coast area is planned to encompass many diseases of sub-tropical crops, whilst the visit to Tamborine will complement much of the symposium on biological control of plant pathogens. It is hoped that members will consider these tours as an integral part of the Conference in planning their itineraries and give an early indication of their participation.

4th International Symposium on Virus Diseases of Ornamental Plants

A symposium on virus diseases of ornamental plants will be held at Noordwijkerhout in The Netherlands from May 3 to May 8, 1976 under the auspices of the International Society for Horticultural Science. All aspects of virus diagnosis, spread and control will be covered and attendance is limited to research workers active in this field.
