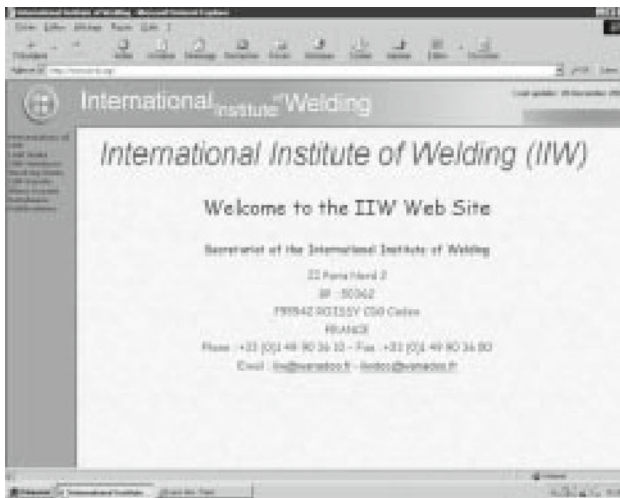


Fig. 1. Web Site put on line on 03 October 2002.

Since 03 October 2001, the new version of the IIW Web Site (Fig. 1) was on-line with an improved appearance. Much information on the IIW was available with a free access.

Since 13 May 2002, an updated version is on-line with a more user-friendly navigation tool.

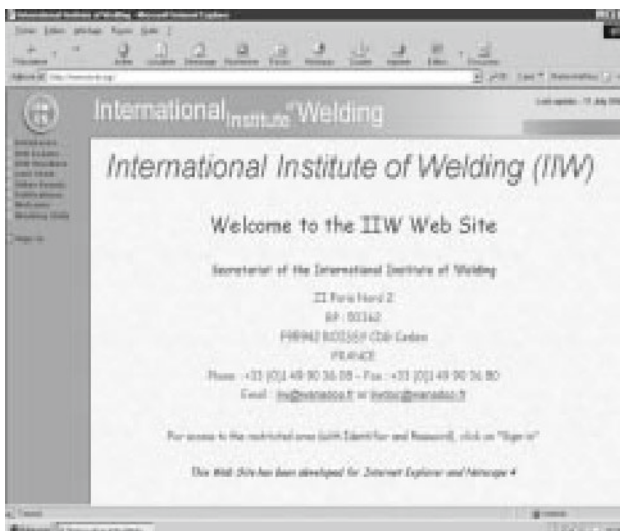


Fig. 2. Web Site put on line on 13 May 2002.

The new version of IIW Web Site (Fig. 2) includes two parts:

- A **Public area** (Free access, identified by a white symbol before the menu name).
- A **Restricted area** (identified by a padlock before the menu name).

THE MENU "DATABASES" gives access to:

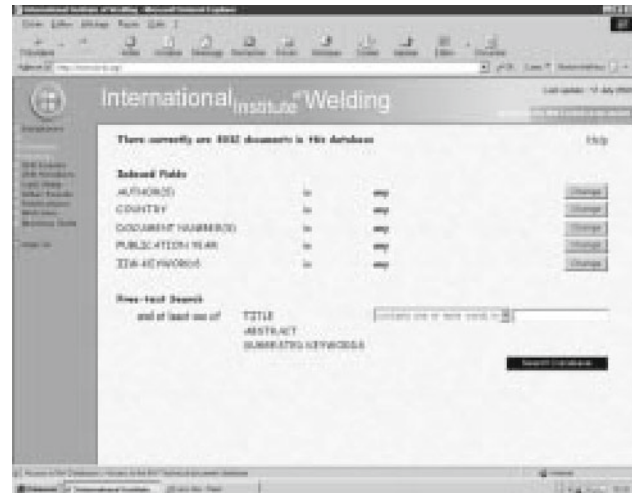


Fig. 3. Access to the IIW Technical document database.

- The IIW Technical database (Fig. 3).

- The catalogue of published IIW documents or papers presented during an IIW event.
- The list of coming IIW meetings.

Also available in the restricted area are:

- The list of all IIW Working Unit documents (including administrative ones).
- The database of repair case fatigue failures.

THE MENU "IIW EVENTS" gives access to:

- The 2001 IIW events and the Annual Assembly held in Ljubljana (Slovenia).
- The 2002 IIW events and the Annual Assembly held in Copenhagen (Denmark).
- The past IIW events including:
 - Public Sessions

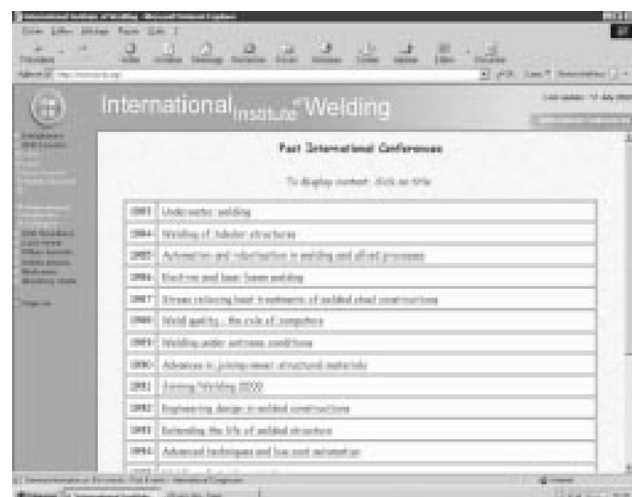


Fig. 4. Access to the list of all IIW International Conferences.

 - International Conferences (Fig. 4)

- International Congresses
- Colloquia

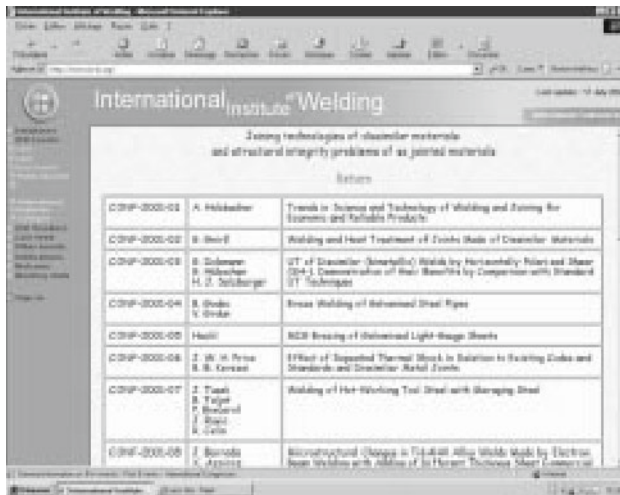


Fig. 5. Access to the list of papers presented during the 2001 International Conference.

By selecting one of these past events, the list of papers presented is displayed (Fig. 5).

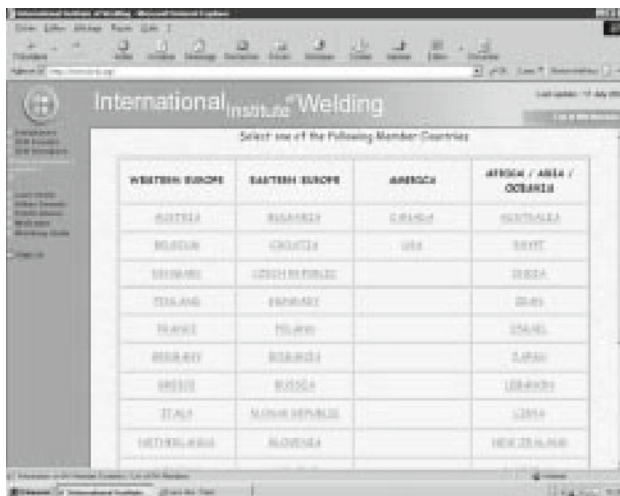


Fig. 6. Access to the list of IIW Members.

- The current list of IIW members (Fig. 6).

THE MENU "LAST NEWS" gives access to:

- Deadlines for specific actions.
- Date of loading of IIW documents.

THE MENU "OTHER EVENTS" gives access to:

- A list of events organised by the IIW Member Societies.

THE MENU "PUBLICATIONS" provides information on:

- Books.
- Proceedings.
- Contents of the IIW Journal "Welding in the World" (Fig. 7).

THE MENU "WELCOME" provides different information on:

- The organisation.
- The activities.

THE MENU "WORKING UNITS" provides information on:

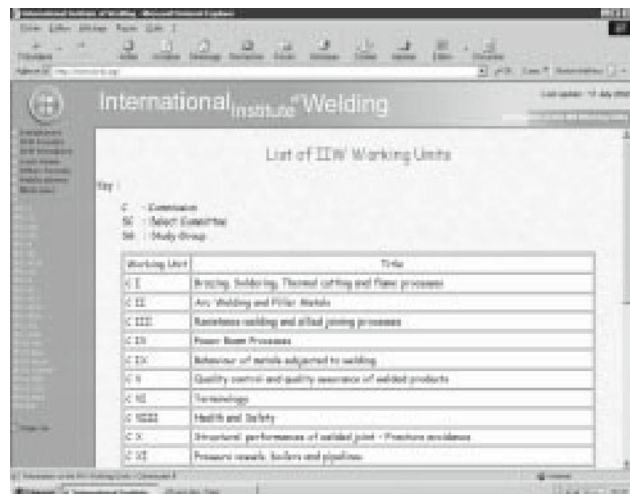


Fig. 9. List of the IIW Working Units.

- The different IIW Working Units. The list of these units is displayed (Fig. 9).

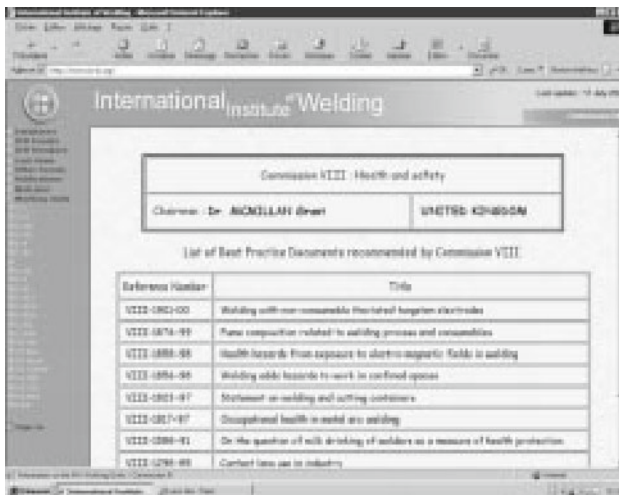


Fig. 10. Details on Commission VIII.

The sub-menus corresponding to each of the IIW Working Units provide more detailed information (Fig. 10), if available, on these Working Units such as:

- Name of the Chairman.
- Terms of reference.
- Working programme.
- List of Best Practice Documents.

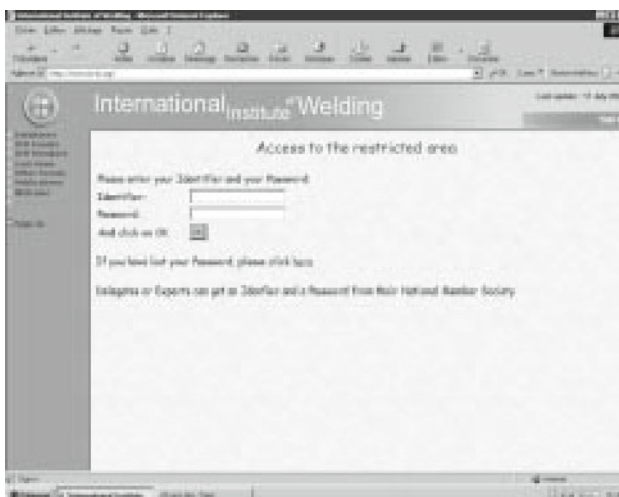


Fig. 11. Introduction of the Identifier and its corresponding password.

IN ORDER TO ACCESS THE RESTRICTED AREA, use the Identifier and the corresponding password provided by your National Delegation (Fig. 11). Once identified by the server, you have free access during your whole session to both the public area and the restricted area.

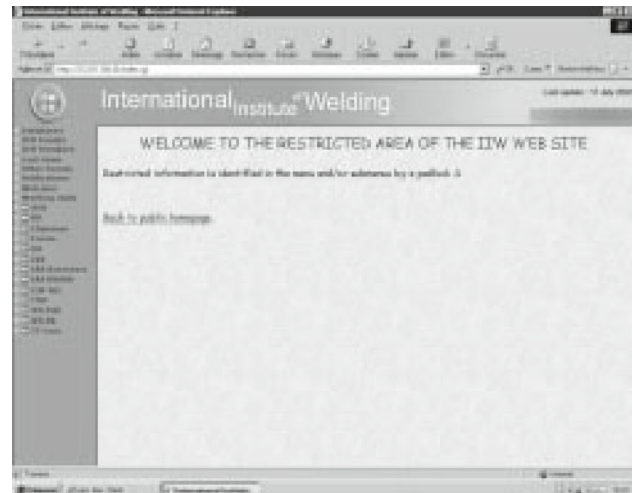


Fig. 12. Home page of the restricted area.

A new list of menus is then displayed. Those menus corresponding to the restricted area are displayed with a padlock before the name (Fig. 12).

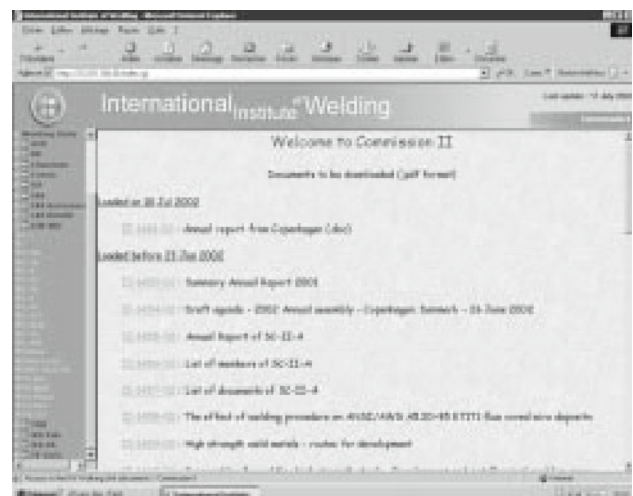


Fig. 13. Details on Commission II downloadable documents.

Selecting one of these menus, gives access to the downloadable IIW Working Unit documents (Fig. 13). Over 600 documents are now available on the IIW Web Site.
