All abstracts submitted to Jackie Newman should follow these guidelines:

1. Title, author(s) given Last name, First name(s); brief mailing address of the first author; affiliation(s) without addresses of other author(s).
2. Text of the abstract is limited to 300 words, inclusive of all words, but excluding the title, the author(s), and address heading.
3. No tables or Figures are to be included in the abstract.
4. Use 1" margins.
5. Type all heading materials in capital letters.
6. Do not leave a space after the heading information.
7. Submit abstracts and other materials in both hard copy and on an IBM compatible disk in Word or WordPerfect, or in ASCII; DOS in preferred, windows accepted.
Note: Selected abstracts at the discretion of the editor, will be chosen for inclusion in *Appetite* an international refereed journals with headquarters in England.
