

POPULAR HIGH-TEMPERATURE CONFERENCE HELD IN CINCINNATI

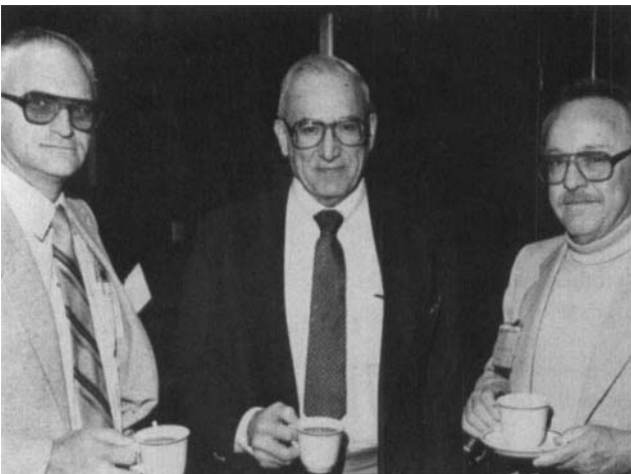
